

## PERSONAL APPEARANCE

A neat personal appearance will be stressed throughout the week. The rooms and dormitory area will be inspected daily.

## ACCOMMODATIONS

Excellent accommodations are provided. Cadets are quartered two to a room. Separate facilities are provided for male and female cadets. Rooms are heated and air-conditioned, close to adequate rest room and shower facilities. A lounge with TV, recreational facilities, a clean modern dining room, well-lighted classrooms, and on-the-spot television are provided. Indoor and outdoor recreation facilities are available which include basketball, volleyball and physical exercise room.

## FOOD

A balanced diet of good, wholesome food is provided. Snacks are available for a small cost at bed time. A soft drink and candy machine is located in the lounge. The blessing is asked before each meal. Table manners are stressed. Tables for four are used and seating is changed regularly, helping all cadets to become better acquainted with one another.

## INSTRUCTION

Qualified instructors are from the KBI, FBI, state elected officials and highway patrolmen. All are skilled in the many and varied phases of law enforcement work.

## TRAINING

Every cadet receives training in firearms instruction and range safety, personal defense tactics, history of law enforcement, law enforcement techniques, pursuit driving on the driving range, emergency medical care, laws of arrest, search and seizures, courtroom trial procedures, and the responsibilities of citizens regardless of age.



## EMERGENCY ENDORSEMENT

Parents are asked to give authorization for the performance of emergency medical and dental care. This would never be used, except in case of an emergency. The cadet must be physically able to compete in the week-long program. Accident insurance is carried by The American Legion. The Highway Patrol personnel in charge of the cadets are all safety conscious and there are rules that must be adhered to at all times. Failure to comply with the rules and regulations of the Academy may result in immediate dismissal from the program.

## SELECTION PROCESS

The final selection of cadets is made by a committee from the Kansas Highway Patrol, The Kansas American Legion and the Kansas American Legion Auxiliary. Both the Post/Unit and the cadet will be notified if the applicant is selected. Candidates not selected will also be notified so they may become applicants for Boys' and/or Girl's State if they so desire.

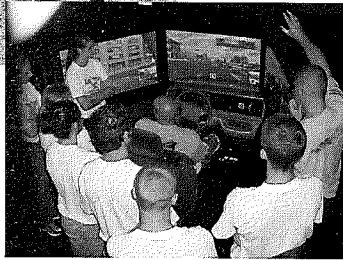

## PURPOSE

The purpose of the Cadet Law Enforcement Academy is to help young Kansans gain knowledge regarding the training and responsibilities of Law Enforcement Officers. Hopefully, they will better understand and have greater respect and appreciation for lawmen at all levels. They are asked upon their return to speak to civic, school and youth organizations, helping those people to respect, appreciate and give their support to law enforcement officials.



## TRAINING

To be eligible, the applicants must be juniors in high school, have a "C+" average scholastically for Sophomore and first semester of Junior year, and be physically able to participate in all activities in the week-long program. They are to complete an application which includes a signed doctor's endorsement of their physical condition, and a signed endorsement by their high school principal or superintendent, their American Legion Commander or American Legion Auxiliary President, and a local law enforcement official (Sheriff, Chief of Police, Policeman, Highway Patrol). Last, but not least, they must believe in the principles of maintaining law and order, and service to God and country. Applications must be submitted to: Kansas Department Headquarters, The American Legion, 1314 Topeka Ave., Topeka, KS 66612, by March 31.



## WHEN AND WHERE

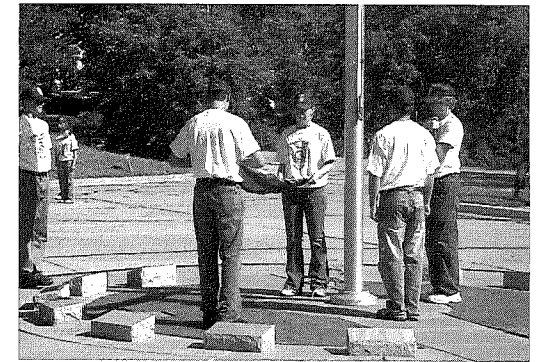
The program will be held the first part of June at the Kansas Highway Patrol Training Academy located at 2025 E. Iron. The Academy is off I-70, Ohio St. exit and South to Iron. Cadets will be expected to arrive Sunday afternoon between 3 and 5 p.m. The first meal will be at 6 p.m. and an orientation period will begin promptly at 7 p.m. Retirement of Colors and graduation will be at 5 p.m. on Friday with a reception following.

## SPONSORS

The overall sponsorship is by the Kansas Highway Patrol, The Kansas American Legion and The Kansas American Legion Auxiliary. The individual sponsorship of a cadet is by one of the Kansas American Legion Posts/Units. Other organizations may sponsor a cadet, but no cadet will be accepted except through a Kansas American Legion Post or Unit. No enrollment fee will be refunded if an applicant voluntarily withdraws their application prior to the session if their billet is not filled.

## COST

The cost of the program is underwritten by the sponsor. The sponsor's fee will include everything needed by the cadet, such as insurance, notebook, tee-shirts, cap, ammunition, and so forth. The session will end Friday evening with the graduation ceremonies.



## CLOTHES

Each cadet will bring their own personal articles. Slacks or wash pants will be worn during the week. Gym clothes for outdoor calisthenics, and clothing suitable for the firing range will be needed. A supply of underwear, gym shoes, socks, handkerchiefs, jacket or sweater, pajamas, and rain coat should be included. Three or four cadet t-shirts will be issued. (The cadet's name should be placed on all clothing for identification purposes.) No laundry facilities are available, so a week's supply of clothing is necessary. All other recreational equipment will be provided.
